What is the number one issue facing North Carolina and your district?

Liberalism. Liberals are well intentioned but ignorant people. The unintended consequences of their legislation has led NC to where it is today.

In 2007, the North Carolina General Assembly authorized counties, subject to voter approval, the ability to impose an additional general fund revenue source (a .4% land transfer tax or a .25% sales tax). To date, the transfer tax has been defeated in every county (16) where it has been considered. Would you support legislation to repeal the transfer tax option? Would you support legislation to repeal the sales tax option?

I would vote to repeal any tax option.

Do you support a local-option sales tax (similar to South Carolina's "Pennies for Progress") that would be used for school capital needs, roads, or other public infrastructure improvements?

Yes, but only if the language of the bill specified the use of the funds and it could not be diverted to the general fund. It should also be accompanied by a lowering of the property tax.

Should local governments be allowed to adopt Adequate Public Facilities Ordinances (APFO) as a means of stopping or slowing growth?

It is up to each community and should be put to the voters.

Would you consider changing the current NCDOT funding formula to make it more equitable for the growing urban areas? If so, what would you propose?

I would propose limiting the amount the state can take away from a county. 90% of the proceeds from the county should be returned and used in that county for improvements.

What should the state do to protect and ensure we have an adequate supply of water to meet our current and future water demands?

Not allow development that overtaxes the water supply. Pretty simple.
