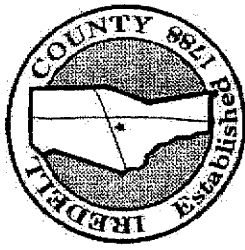

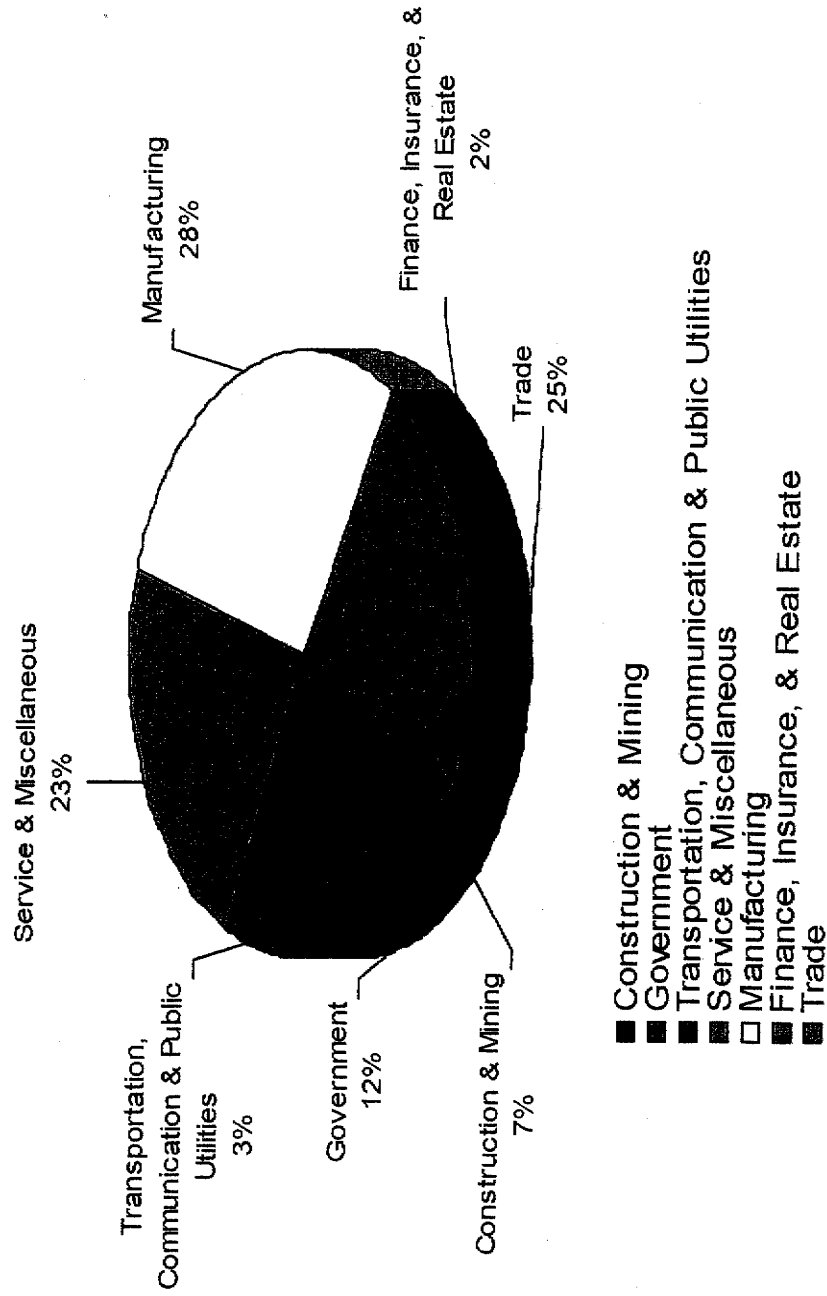

Employment Diversity



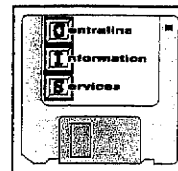
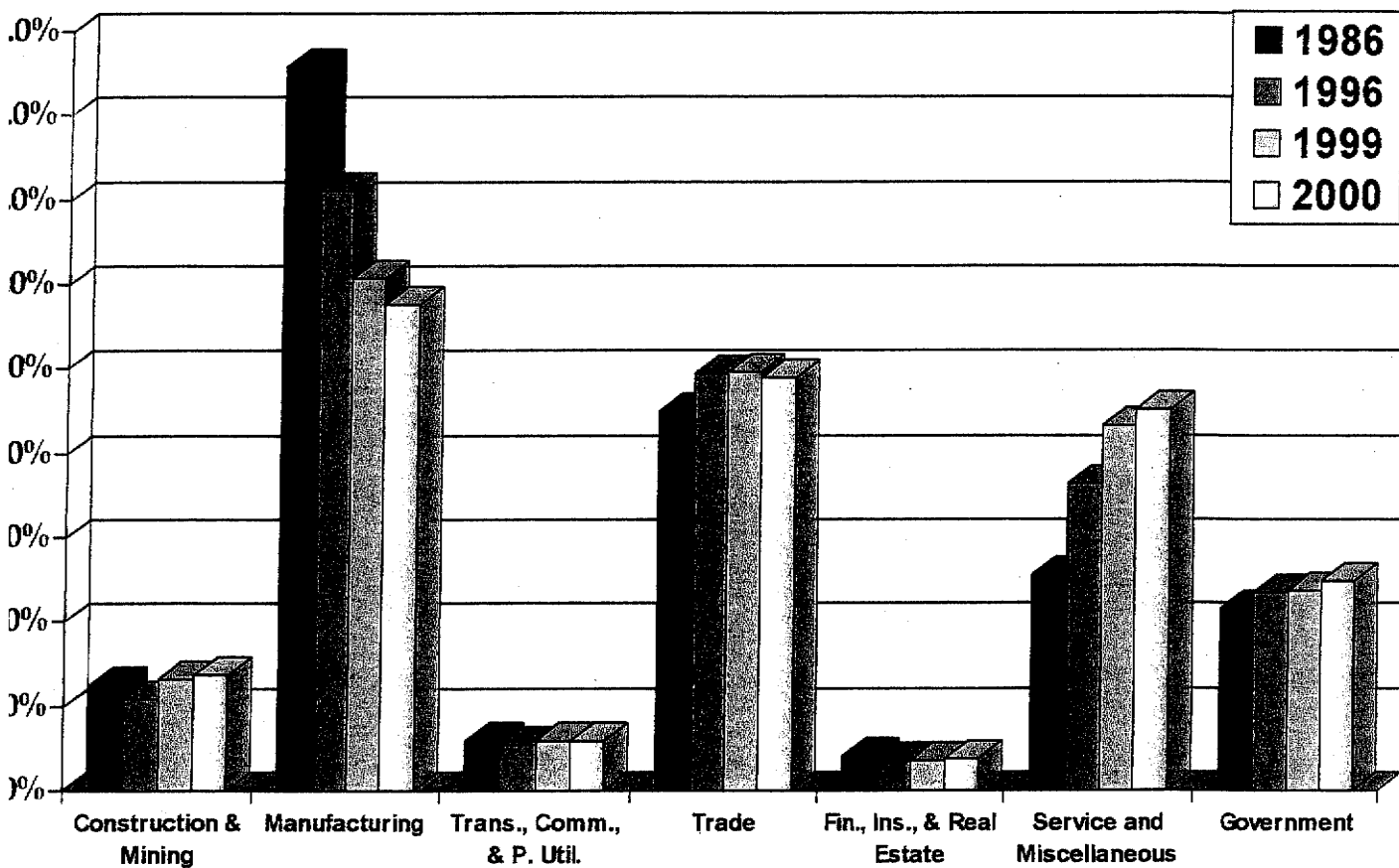
Total Employment By Place of Work (2002)

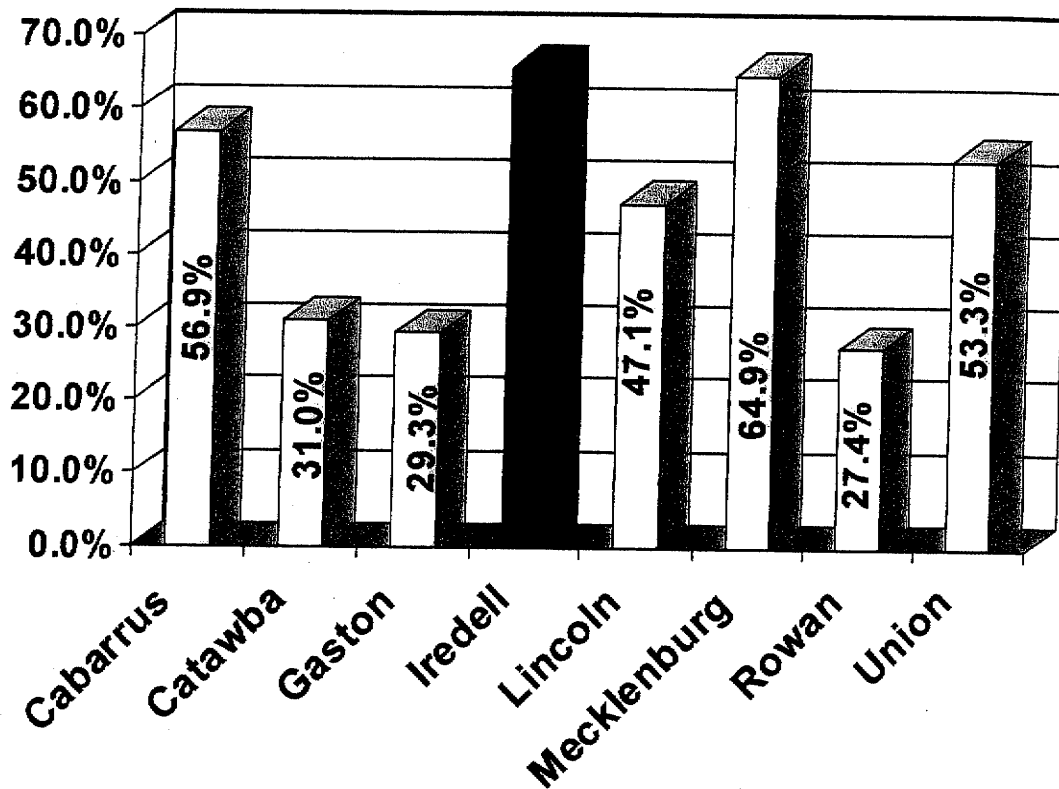
Percent of Jobs By Type

Iredell County, 1986, 1996, 1999 and 2000

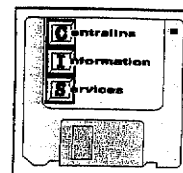

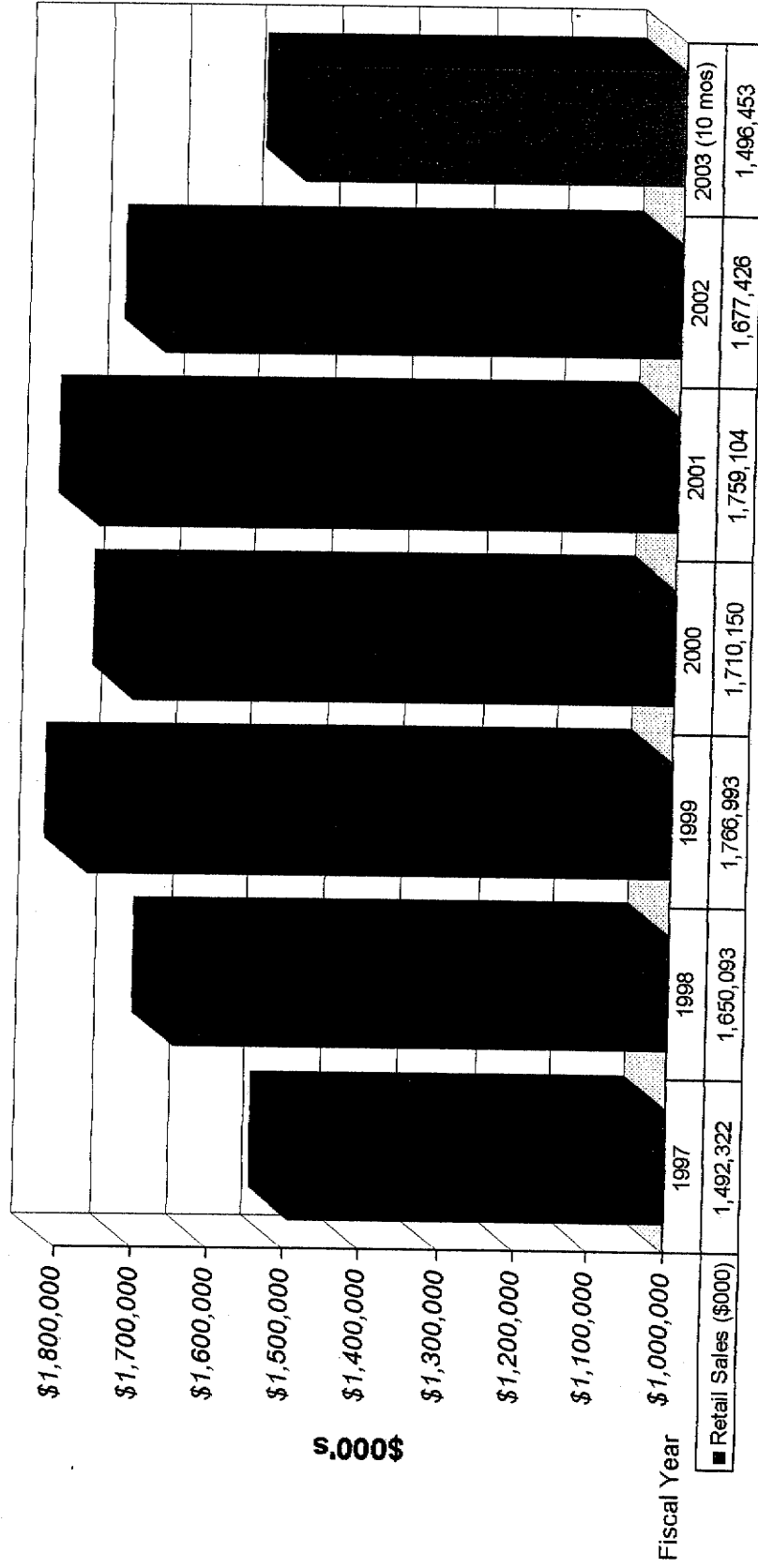
FY 1990 - 91 Through FY 2001 - 02
