Tega Cay's LakeShore complete

TEGA CAY — LakeShore, the project that is responsible for doubling the city's population since 2000, is nearly complete.

As of Monday, developer Newland Communities turned over control of all public neighborhood streets and infrastructure to the city. The company still has some work left to finish, including planting and replacing street trees in the development, which will be done in the coming weeks when the weather is more favorable, Newland spokesman Bill Mumford said.

Over the years the project has been the source of some controversy in the city. Early on, clear cutting trees on massive swaths of the development helped drive out former Mayor Steve Hamilton. His successor, current Mayor Bob Runde, campaigned on a platform opposed to clear cutting.



However, Newland is also largely responsible for the city now owning the Tega Cay Golf Club. It sold the club to Tega Cay two years ago, along with other properties including the city's Administration Building, which had served as a model home and sales office for Newland.
